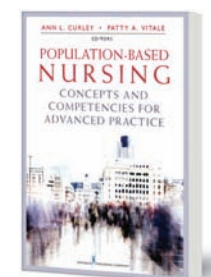


### Comprehensive Systematic Review for Advanced Nursing Practice

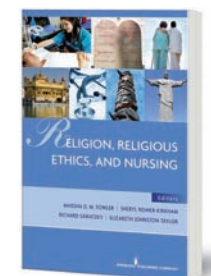

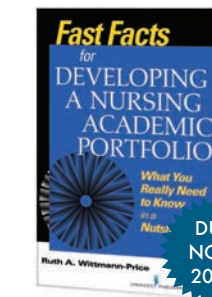
### Religion, Religious Ethics, and Nursing

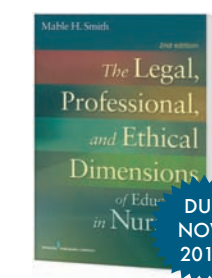

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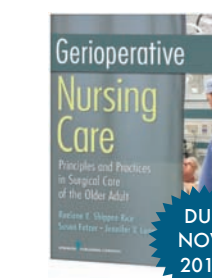
### The Legal, Professional, and Ethical Dimensions of Education in Nursing, Second Edition
