### Guidelines for Contributors

*Ethical Human Psychology and Psychiatry* welcomes unsolicited submissions. Inquiries about potential subjects can be made in advance with the editors. All manuscripts should be original, unpublished, and not under consideration for publication elsewhere. The usual categories are articles (review articles, theoretical articles, methodological articles, reports of empirical studies, case studies), essays, brief reports, and book reviews. The manuscript, including abstract, tables, and bibliography, must be double-spaced and prepared according to the 6th edition of the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association*.

Please submit manuscripts electronically to Editor in Chief Brian Kean ([brian.kean@scu.edu.au](mailto:brian.kean@scu.edu.au)). All figures must be submitted in camera-ready form. In addition, photos and line art figures should be sent as a tiff (300ppi) or eps files. To facilitate blind review, the author’s name should not appear on the manuscript. The title, author’s name, academic degrees, current position, address, telephone number, and e-mail address should be included on a separate title page. Authors are responsible for the content and accuracy of any statements made in their articles. When reproducing tables or figures, either complete or summarizing printed content, the author is responsible for obtaining permission from the original publisher.
